pursuant to **Article 13 of the GDPR**

Your rights

- Right of access to the personal data concerning you (Art. 15 GDPR).
- Right to rectification (Art. 16 GDPR).
- Right to erasure (Art. 17 GDPR), unless compelling reasons to the contrary apply, e.g. ongoing investigations by law enforcement authorities.
- Right to restriction of processing where one of the conditions set out in Art. 18 GDPR applies, e.g. if you have lodged an objection (Art. 21 GDPR) to the processing.
- Right to lodge a complaint if you consider that the processing of personal data concerning you infringes the GDPR (Art. 77 GDPR).

Retention period and erasure of data

- Recorded image data will be erased no later than 72 hours after recording. Image sequences required for evidential purposes will be retained for as long as necessary for the investigation and prosecution of criminal offences.



Purpose and legal basis of data processing

- Ensuring that passengers can use public transport safely and without disruption
- Prevention and de-escalation of dangerous or critical situations
- Protection of employees and passengers from assaults
- Exercise of the BVG's right to regulate access to its premises
- Prevention and prosecution of criminal offences
- The legal basis for the use of bodycams is Art. 6(1)(e), (2), and (3) GDPR in conjunction with Section 20(1), nos. 1 and 2, and (4) of the Berlin Data Protection Act (BlnDSG).



Disclosure of data to third parties

Data from the bodycams is stored by our data processor, NetCo Professional Services GmbH, Am Mönchenfelde 13, 38889 Blankenburg, under a data processing agreement pursuant to Art. 28 GDPR.

In the course of investigations, the data may be provided to the competent law enforcement authorities, in particular the Berlin Police and the Public Prosecutor's Office.
